### **1/18/01 – Minutes of the previous meeting**

- The minutes of the 6<sup>th</sup> December meeting were proposed as correct by Councillor Davies and seconded by Councillor Hallett.

### **1/18/02 – Matters arising**

- Fairwater Solar Farm – The solar farm’s solicitors have still not replied to our letter or emails. The Clerk will send a recorded delivery letter asking for a response and warning that we will contact the Solicitors’ Regulation Authority if none is received.
- Councillor Taylor has obtained a price quotation of £10 each for “20 is plenty” signs. Councillors agreed that we should buy 10 of these.

### **1/18/03 – Police matters**

- The monthly police report was circulated. There were no items of particular concern.
- A large quantity of material was recently fly-tipped. Councillors Davies and Schofield spent a long time reviewing more than 100 vehicle movements on the CCTV recording, but unfortunately it was not possible to identify the culprits.
- Councillor Taylor mentioned “Gwent Watch”, an email system that alerts people to suspicious behaviour. She will forward details to other councillors.

### **1/18/04 – Planning**

- No applications received

### **1/18/05 Roads & Rights of Way**

- Recent high winds have caused renewed concern over the state of trees bordering Bridge Terrace. The Clerk will write to Newport City Homes, who own the trees, asking for an update on their survey.

### **1/18/06 – Correspondence**

- Invoices totalling £230.36 have been received from Simasy for domain registration and web hosting. These have been paid.

### **1/18/07 – Finance**

- The third precept payment of £1211 has been received from Newport City Council.

- Councillors reviewed the 2017-18 expenditure to date and agreed the budget for 2018-19. The Clerk will submit this to Newport Council.
